
A SELF-GUIDED CAMPUS TOUR

INFORMATION YOU NEED

1. Library



- Offers 5 levels of printed books and journals and an extensive collection of online journals and e-books.
- Study rooms and desks available for bookings.
- A popular café and lounge area for relaxed study and discussion
- IT Help (iSolutions) get help if you have any issues with your computer.
- Computer rooms
- The library is open 24 hours during the exam period.

2. The Student Hub

3. Jubilee Sports Complex



- Gym with 200+ fitness stations and cutting-edge fitness features.
- Eight badminton courts, netball, volleyball, basketball, and squash courts (the only hall in the region suitable for international basketball matches)
- Technogym indoor cycling studio and climbing and bouldering wall.
- 25m swimming pool
- Memberships at affordable rates available for students, staff, alumni, and local community
- Flexible membership options that can be purchased online or through reception.
- With membership comes free use of the complex's swimming pool, an indoor bouldering wall, spinning and martial arts rooms and various studios, access to fitness facilities, classes, and many indoor and outdoor courts and pitches.

Other Sport & Wellbeing sites: Wide Lane (an outdoor sports ground for football, rugby, tennis, etc., which is on the UniLink bus route (get off at the Airport stop), Watersports Centre for powerboating and sailing, Mayflower gym.

4. SUSU Building (B40)



- The Stag's: Student pub, shows live sports, live music events, and karaoke on Thursdays.
- The Advice Centre: Located above the Stag's; provides all students with free, independent, and confidential advice and information on practical matters.

5. Red Brick Area (Outdoors)



- The Redbrick Market: Stock up on baked goods, cakes, nuts, olives, snacks and more.
- Fruit and vegetable market every Monday during term-time

6. SUSU Shop



- SUSU shop stocks a wide range of university gifts and merchandise such as hoodies, t-shirts, water bottles, etc.
- · Located in the main SUSU Building

7. The Piazza



- The largest eating & meeting place on Campus
- · Offers a variety of drinks, cold, cooked, and take-out meals.

8. SUSU Building (Main)



- Heart of student activities
- The Bridge A bistro bar and entertainment venue (e.g., language exchange) + free bookshelf
- SUSU Lettings Helps students with finding private accommodation.
- Bar 3, The Café serve hot and cold food, drinks, and snacks throughout the day.
- Union Films A 330-seat cinema managed by students, which offers movies at affordable rates (or sometimes for free!)
- The Cube A 1,700-capacity nightclub for some university events (e.g., Freshers' week parties, Graduate Ball, Mexican party)
- Squash courts. Students can book with their gym membership.
- Martial arts studio
- Dance studio for dance societies such as jazz, contemporary, ballet, etc.
- Old sports hall used for five-a-side football, cricket, handball, Frisbee, and roller hockey.

9. Students' Union Retail Centre



- Nisalocal: Food, drinks, stationery, snacks, coffee
- UniLink Office on Level 2
- The Shine Hairdresser offers a range of services from cutting, and styling to colouring and traditional hot towel wet shaving.

Valley Gardens



- Home to many rare plant and animal species
- 2 ponds at the end of the Garden
- Great place to relax and connect with nature

• A social hub for university staff and postgraduates and houses restaurants, a bar, and a café for coffee.

12. University Health Centre



- Register here with a General Practitioner (GP) ASAP

13. Turner Sims Concert Hall



- The year-round program includes classical, jazz, world, and folk music.
- Over 60 concerts a year

14. The Annexe



- · A few classrooms for business school lectures
- Regularly hosts shows by societies.

15. Centenary Building



- A brand new 7-floor teaching and learning Centre with several large lecture theatres and bookable seminar rooms.
- Centenary restaurant and Taning Lemon Tea at street level

16. Highfield Interchange (Outdoors)



- All unlink buses connecting the University, the city, and Halls of Residence.
- Interchange Café nearby which offers snacks and drinks.

17. Faith and Reflection Centre



- Open for both staff and students to enjoy Monday - Friday, 10:00 - 17:00 in term time
- Pop in and have a free tea or coffee, have your lunch.

18. Murray Building



 Houses the Financial Laboratory, which simulates a trading room environment and includes 24 Bloomberg terminals and 2 independent terminals with DataStream.

19. The Gower Building



- University Post office
- Costa and Pret a Manger: You can get fresh coffee, sandwiches and hot breakfasts.
- You can get a free cup of coffee if you're lucky.
- The **Rhino** loves drinking hot coffee more than you do, I promise.

20. Southampton Business School



- Situated at the newest **Boldrewood Innovation Campus**.
- Houses several key offices and facilities.
